

UPDATE FROM THE VESTRY

Once again, St Margaret's finds itself in a period of interregnum. However, we are delighted to tell you that Bishop Kevin has formally appointed Canon Barry Gilbert to be our interim Priest-in-Charge. We are most grateful to Barry for taking this on.

As we continue to progress through another full Lockdown, we are obviously saddened and disappointed that all churches in Scotland must remain closed. It is particularly frustrating as we had managed all our Advent and Christmas services extremely well and they had been much enjoyed by all who came. We even welcomed a real live organist – thank you Hilary – at our Celebration of Christmas in Words and Music. It made such a difference.

Tuesday 2nd February is the festival of Candlemas – the day that celebrates the ritual purification of Mary, 40 days after the birth of her son Jesus. In many families it's remembered as the day by which the final Christmas decorations (i.e. the ones that got forgotten on Twelfth Night) really should be taken down. And in many Irish counties, **Candlemas** is celebrated with the Boxty, a traditional Irish potato pancake consisting of finely grated raw potato and mashed potato with flour, baking soda, buttermilk and sometimes egg. Well, for those who are looking for new Lockdown recipes, there's a challenge!

The season of Lent will soon be on us. Ash Wednesday falls on 17th February. Barry Gilbert has very kindly offered to hold a virtual service at 6pm that day. The Zoom link will be sent out, so do join if you are able.

OBITUARY

MARY JOHNSTONE

Mary married her husband George whose father was the minister of East Kilbride at the time having previously been the minister of Balmaclellan, as had his grandfather and his great grandfather. Born in Barnsley, Mary qualified as a mid-wife in Sheffield and subsequently joined the Queen Alexandra Royal Army Nursing Corps. Her first posting was to Nairobi, Kenya where she met and married George who was doing his National Service with the Royal Army Medical Corps. George was a specialist in obstetrics and gynaecology. George subsequently decided to sign up for a long-term career in the army. George spent the majority of his career stationed in different parts of the world and Mary often told me of her times in Germany, Singapore and Hong Kong which she had particularly enjoyed while the five children were growing up. On George's retirement they moved to New Galloway and by the time we arrived Mary was the Chair of the Ladies' Guild.

Life in the military meant that they were used to worshipping at services which depended on the denomination of the padre. This meant that while Mary had been brought up as a Roman Catholic and George as Presbyterian they were both content to move between Kells and St Margaret's. After George's stroke they both came to St Margaret's and I was always pleased when George was there because he laughed loudly if I said anything slightly amusing.

Mary was a very good hostess and our first Harvest Lunch was held at Ashbank. She also delivered Meals on Wheels and the harvest produce in the area around New Galloway. Sometime after George died Mary had to deal with several problems in her life which she bore with a dogged resolution before moving to Derbyshire to be close to her youngest son Tom. Her lifelong motto was "I can, I must and I will". She was predeceased by two of her children. Mary was a generous, kind and quiet woman. I think that I can tell you now that it is thanks to Mary that we acquired a new organ for the Centenary celebrations at St Margaret's.
