

UPDATE FROM THE VESTRY

THE WAY FORWARD FOR ST MARGARET'S

As you know, we are currently in the fortunate position of having Canon Barry Gilbert as our Priest-in-Charge, but this is and was only a temporary measure.

Bishop Kevin and Dean Reuben have been giving a lot of thought to the future ministry of St Margaret's and, after a number of discussions with Vestry members, they are proposing we consider the possibility of sharing a new Priest-in-Charge with All Saints, Challoch near Newton Stewart.

The following outline of progress to date has been agreed with Bishop Kevin:

Ministry at All Saints', Challoch and St Margaret's, New Galloway

The two Vestries of All Saints' and St Margaret's have been working with Bishop Kevin and the Dean to explore a way of resourcing ministry in Challoch and New Galloway in the coming years. At the moment, the two Charges are working with the Diocese and developing a plan to create a Priest-in-Charge post for 3-5 years.

Currently, we are in the stages of planning the financing and housing to support a full-time priest and we will be working with the Dean to put together a complete package which will help us prepare to start the process of writing a role description and Charges' Profile. We then hope to move towards advertising and interviewing for a new priest. The anticipation is that the person appointed will work equally in each Charge as well as contribute to the life of the diocese, to help develop the ministry and mission of each congregation.

This initiative comes from Bishop Kevin who is committed to helping and supporting Charges grow in their outreach and worship amongst the communities they serve. Please pray for the planning, preparations and advertising which will be taking place during the coming months.

As a Vestry, we all feel this is a very positive step forward and are excited at the thought of sharing a priest with Challoch – which has a very similar demographic and style of worship to us.

We will keep you informed as and when we know more ourselves but, in the meantime, if you have any queries or thoughts you would like to share, please do get in touch with any member of the Vestry.

HELPING WITH SERVICES

After many years, Jean Dowswell has decided that the time has come for her to step down as our Eucharistic Assistant. We are most grateful for all she has done and for all the quiet help and support she has provided over many years - and we are pleased she still remains on the Vestry.

However, the Vestry is conscious that we are now even more short of lay people who might be able to assist with our services – bell ringing, reading lessons, doing the intercessions or even taking a service with Reserved Sacrament if we don't have a priest on a particular Sunday. If you feel the latter is something you would like to find out more about, Barry would be more than happy to talk to you, and training would be provided, free of charge, by the Diocese.

Linda Gerraty has kindly agreed to oversee altar preparation for the Eucharist and is looking for volunteers to add to the rota. We already have several people who are happy to Read during services but it would be nice to expand that rota as well.

Please think about what you might be able to do: the more people we have the better!

REFRESHMENTS IN CHURCH

The current guidance from the Advisory Committee is that refreshment can now be served in Church before or after the service. However, people will be required to remain seated in their household groups and anyone moving about or serving will be required to wear a face covering at all times. Social distancing will still have to be observed between those in different household or support groups.

This Sunday we plan to serve tea and coffee after the service at the back of the Church. People not wishing to stay for refreshments will be asked to leave first. Those staying for refreshments will be asked to move to the back of the Church (wearing a face covering) and sit in the single seats, which have been positioned either singularly or in pairs. Please occupy the seats according to your household or support group. You should remain seated; coffee and tea will be brought round on a tray by servers wearing face coverings.

LADIES GUILD

The Ladies Guild will now be able to resume offering refreshments after the Sunday service and remain within the guidance. In order to do so, only people in the same household or support group can be in the utility area together i.e. making coffee or washing up and only one person will serve coffee or tea to those remaining seated. Coffee and tea will be prepared on a tray in the Utility Area and one person will serve it wearing a face covering. Please let me know if you would like to go on the Refreshment Rota.
