REFRESHMENTS IN CHURCH

The current guidance from the Advisory Committee is that refreshment can now be served in Church before or after the service. However, people will be required to remain seated in their household groups and anyone moving about or serving will be required to wear a face covering at all times. Social distancing will still have to be observed between those in different household or support groups, however, that has now been reduced to 1 metre.

If you wish to stay for refreshments please move to the back of the Church (wearing a face covering) and sit in the single seats, which have been positioned either singularly or in pairs. Please occupy the seats according to your household or support group. You should remain seated; coffee and tea will be brought round on a tray by servers wearing face coverings.
