#### NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE

Much work has been going on behind the scenes at St Mary's Cathedral in Glasgow to enable services to be live-streamed. Starting this month, the 11am Eucharist every Sunday will be live-streamed as well as being available on YouYube afterwards. It is hoped to add Choral Evensong in the next few months. The <u>Bishop's Lent Appeal</u> this year is for *Children in Distress*. This is a small, Glasgow-based, Anglican-rooted charity that provides a children's hospice and care centre in Romania.

In 1989, when Romania's communist regime was swept from power by the Populist Revolution, the shocking images of children abandoned in orphanages and hospitals moved many people to take action. One such person was the Revd Dr John Walmsley from St Laurence Church, Barkingside. A true visionary and driving force, Dr Walmsley took part in the first aid convoys and had the idea of creating a charity - The Association for Helping Children in Romania. In the years that followed, the centres and programmes expanded, setting new standards for children with neurological conditions, severe disability and autism. The charity structure was changed to that of a foundation and was renamed: *Fundația Copii în Dificultate* or *Children in Distress*.

Today the charity cares for children living with the most severe disabilities, whether the result of accident, infection, genetic and neurological disorders or autism. They continue to set new standards for respite, palliative and terminal care and multiple therapies, along with education, development and training programmes. Their mission is

to cure, sometimes; to help, often; to comfort, always.

## The Great Ormond Street Nurse by Vanessa Martin

Many of you have met John and Vanessa Martin from Sandgreen who have been regular visitors to St Margaret's over the last few years since John kindly agreed to take occasional Sunday services for us. We've recently discovered that Vanessa has been busy writing a heart-warming memoir of life as a Student Nurse in the 1960s. Last month her book *The Great Ormond Street Nurse* was published by Welbeck, describing a world full of laughter, heartache and hard work. Nostalgic and charming, *The Great Ormond Street Nurse* is the heroic tale of a woman who has dedicated over 40 years to the NHS as a paediatric and general trained nurse.

Most of Vanessa's work was in the frontline services managing wards in hospitals, but latterly she managed a children's Plastic Surgery Ward before she became a Nurse Consultant and the Clinical Director of a Cleft Lip and Palate Service which covered the East Midlands Region. She won the Royal College of Nursing/Nursing Standard 'Nurse of the Year 2000' award for her work with families of children with cleft lip and palate and was awarded a Fellowship by the Royal College of Nursing.

As well as some radio interviews, the Sunday Post featured Vanessa's book recently for a serious discussion about the NHS. And look out for an interview and photographs coming up in D&G Life. We look forward to the Martin's next visit to New Galloway, so that we can hear more about the book and what inspired her to write it.
