UPDATE FROM THE VESTRY

Our revised policy on the Eucharist has been in place for a month now and is working well. It feels good to be using the altar rail for communion again and, given our relatively small numbers, it is easy for individuals and household groups to keep a respectful distance from each other. We are offering communion in one kind, or both kinds, with each communicant deciding whether to receive the host only, retain the host and intinct when the chalice passes, or consume the host and drink from the chalice. And, as always, anyone who would prefer just to receive a blessing is welcome to come forward. Whoever is celebrating is continuing to wear a mask to administer communion and to follow advice on hand sanitising.

We could not continue to celebrate the Eucharist every Sunday without the services of our loyal and supportive band of retired clergy – Barry Gilbert, John Martin, John McHale, David Humphries and Stuart Bain. We are extremely grateful for their continued help.

Stuart Bain has kindly agreed to run a course for training lay worship leaders. Challoch already have several worship leaders in their congregation and report that the combination of Eucharist and Reserved Sacrament services works well for them with members either helping with worship or with pastoral work. With fewer priests available it is thought that this might be the way forward for churches in future. If anyone would be interested in finding out more, please talk to a member of the Vestry, or with Stuart when he visits us on 3rd July.

As regards our advertisement for a shared Priest-in-Charge with All Saints' Challoch, the Dean reports that we have had one application with another two potentially in the pipeline. A statement from the Bishop and the Dean is printed below:

"Bishop Kevin and Dean Reuben have been engaged with informal conversations about the post of Priest-in-Charge with Anglican priests who wanted to find out more about ministry in the Scottish Episcopal Church. Their delight in discovering the level of support available in the Diocese of Glasgow and Galloway was good to hear as many Anglican Priests are facing untold challenges. Nonetheless, the specific tasks of the role here in Challoch and New Galloway have enabled some to realise that their ministry is not to be with us. It is good to help potential candidates find their way and Bishop Kevin is currently in conversation with others who may be able to submit a completed application in due course. We are therefore keeping the application schedule open until we reach a point where a meaningful interview process can take place. Please continue to pray for the right candidate to emerge in the midst of much anxiety in neighbouring provinces. The United Diocese of Glasgow and Galloway is being seen as a good place to come and work, minister and live as we labour together in discerning the right people in the right posts so that all may thrive."
