CHRISTMAS GENEROSITY

For many years, St Margaret's have dedicated their collections at Christmas to a charity chosen by the congregation. Choosing a worthwhile cause is always difficult when there are so many places and people desperate for help and this year at the AGM it was decided to share the money raised between two charities - ShelterBox and CHAS.

On the international stage, ShelterBox's simple strategy of sending emergency shelter and tools to where they are most needed is both practical and useful. Closer to home, CHAS (Children's Hospices Across Scotland) offers a full family support service for babies, children and young people with life-shortening conditions.

The Vestry are delighted to report that just under £1,000 was raised from collections at the Carols by Candlelight service held at St Margaret's and from the Christmas Day service - this money will be divided equally between ShelterBox and CHAS.

RECIPE

From the World Day of Prayer Resource to celebrate Palestine

Date Slice

Ingredients

8oz chopped dates
6 oz sugar
4 oz plain flour
4 oz porridge oats
4 oz butter/marg
1 tsp bicarbonate
1 tsp baking powder
Small carton apple juice – 4 oz
1 tsp vanilla essence

Instructions

Chop dates, add apple juice and cook gently until soft, stir in vanilla essence and cool. Mix flour, bicarbonate, baking powder and oats, rub in butter or marg to make a crumble. Stir in the sugar.

Press half the mixture into an 8in square baking tin, spread the dates over the top and cover with the remaining mixture. Press down.

Cook for 25 -30 mins in an oven at 180c. Cut into square to serve.
