

PRIEST IN CHARGE

Noted dramatist and folklorist, Lady Isabella Augusta Gregory is known as an early proponent of equal rights, and unusually for a woman of her time, was involved in the politics of the day. She celebrated the history that shaped her world, and the natural world that brought joy and life. Inspired by this, she wrote of May, "The month of May is the pleasant time; its face is beautiful; the blackbird sings his full song, the living wood is his holding, the cuckoos are singing and ever singing; there is a welcome before the brightness of the summer."

I always feel that May is a month when so many things are possible. We look back to April and all its showers and tiny buds, we remember with thanks the joyful resurrection of Jesus Christ, and we look forwards to all that might be. In the church calendar, we move on from Easter Day, looking forward to all that might be, remembered in the Ascension of Jesus as he was restored to his Father God's side in the heavenly realms. Although Jesus has left us physically, we still rejoice with the worldwide church as we approach the Day of Pentecost, when those first Apostles and thousands of others were filled with the *ruach*, the breath of the Holy Spirit – Jesus' eternal presence with us.

Suddenly, so many more things became possible, as the *followers of the* way (as the believers became known) were empowered by God himself to follow the command of Jesus to fulfil the words of the Great Commission in Matthew 28 to, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

This command was given to those first disciples, and it still stands for us today, as we seek to follow the Lord with all that we have and with all that we are, offering in service and grateful thanks, all that he has given us.

And surely he is with us, this day, and every day, moving among us in the power of his Spirit.
