BISHOP KEVIN'S FAREWELL

The Right Revd Kevin Pearson, 15th Bishop of Glasgow and Galloway, is retiring in August as he reaches his three-score years and ten. Previously Bishop of Argyll and the Isles, Bishop Kevin was 'translated' to Glasgow and Galloway in 2020. As the country was in the middle of the Covid 19 pandemic, this was not an easy transition as anyone who started a new job during lockdown will know.

In his four years with our Diocese, Bishop Kevin has worked tirelessly: clergy recruitment has been remodelled, our Constitution has been brought into the 21st century, the new Diocesan Centre has been opened and systems and procedures have been updated. He and his wife Elspeth have travelled all over the Diocese meeting people and forging new friendships, not just in individual charges but at events such as Cop 26 in Glasgow.

On a personal level, I find Bishop Kevin an inspirational preacher – he makes me think and wonder and question, and his sermons are always delivered with humour and passion. And I will really miss his guidance; we are blessed to have had him as our Bishop.

Bishop Kevin's farewell service will be held at St Mary's Cathedral at **11am on Saturday 29th June**, when he will celebrate 45 years of ordained public ministry, and where he hopes as many as possible will be able to join together as a diocese. Refreshments will be available after the service. If anyone would like a lift to Glasgow, please let me know as there will be a few cars going.

In response to many queries and suggestions, the Diocese is intending to present Bishop Kevin with a farewell gift from us all on that day in gratitude for everything he has done during his four years with us. If anyone would like to contribute to this, please talk to Cathy Agnew or Dawn.
