## PRIEST IN CHARGE

## **Embracing the Summer Sabbath Rest**

#### Dear Church Family,

As we step into the heart of summer (hopefully with some more sunny days!), our recent Sunday Bible readings remind us of the beauty and necessity of rest. I'd like us to take into our summers the theme of *Summer Sabbath Rest*. I invite you to slow down, reflect, and rejuvenate in God's presence during these warm and peaceful days. Here are some Bible passages, themes, and ideas to guide your Sabbath summer reflections this season.

#### **Bible Passages for Reflection**

#### Genesis 2:2-3

By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done.

**Reflection:** Consider how God's rest after creation sets a pattern for us. How can we make our Sabbath rest a holy time set apart for rejuvenation?

#### Exodus 20:8-11

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God.

**Reflection:** Reflect on the commandment to keep the Sabbath holy. How can we honour this commandment in our busy lives?

#### Mark 2:27

Then he said to them, 'The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath.'

**Reflection:** Jesus teaches that the Sabbath is a gift for our benefit. How can we embrace this gift without turning it into a burden?

#### Matthew 11:28-30

Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

**Reflection:** Meditate on Jesus' invitation to find rest in Him. What burdens do you need to lay down to experience His rest?

#### Psalm 23:1-3

The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul.

**Reflection:** Visualise the peaceful imagery of Psalm 23. How can you create spaces in your life that allow you to lie down in green pastures and be led beside quiet waters?

#### The Gift of Sabbath

In Genesis, God rested on the seventh day after creating the world, setting a divine example for us to follow. The Sabbath is not just a day but a mindset, a sacred time to disconnect from our busy lives and reconnect with God. This July, let's embrace this gift and find peace and restoration in Him.

#### **Summer Events and Opportunities**

**Music** is one of the ways that I connect with God, and find a beautiful peace and rest. This month, our sister church at All Saints, Challoch, is holding a **Musical Soirée** on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> July beginning at 7.00pm. Why not go along and hear the talents of local musicians; from harp to guitar, it'll be a wonderful evening!

**The Scottish Alternative Games** will be held in our own New Galloway on Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> August, from 2-5pm in the park. It's a great opportunity to connect with people, enjoy good food and relaxation. Of course, there's the added bonus of seeing the Gird 'n' Cleek World Championships being contested! St Margaret's is holding our traditional Tombola Stall, and any prizes - both for children and adults - would be gratefully received. Please drop them in the box in the church porch. **Prayer** is an important part of Sabbath, and every Thursday evening at 7.30pm, we continue our weekly online service of **Evening Prayers**. Everyone is welcome to join us on Zoom, and the link is on our website.

**Holidays and Staycations:** Whatever you have planned for the summer, set time aside to **rest** in the beauty of God's creation, **recharge** your batteries - both physical and spiritual, and **remember** that God, who is love, is with you each day.
