Glasgow and Galloway Episcopal Election

Following the retirement of Bishop Kevin at the end of August, the Diocese has now started the process of finding a new Bishop of Glasgow and Galloway. The Right Reverend Andrew Swift, Bishop of Brechin, is our Acting Bishop in the meantime – I have now been at two meetings chaired by Bishop Andrew and he is absolutely on top of his brief; nice man.

Canon 4 sets out the whole process which kicked off with the Preliminary Electoral Synod at the end of September (the Electoral Synod is made up of all clergy and Lay Reps in the Diocese plus the high heidyins such as the Dean, Provost, Synod Clerk etc). At this we agreed the Diocesan description (all charges had earlier given their input), and the Preparatory Committee was elected (two clergy and two laity from the Diocesan Electoral Synod). Other members of the Preparatory Committee include Bishop Andrew (who will act as Convenor) Bishop John (Edinburgh) and various members, clergy and laity, of the Provincial panel for episcopal elections. As I am the Diocesan Lay Rep on the Provincial panel, I will be on the Preparatory Committee whose remit is to draw up a shortlist of candidates for the Diocesan Electoral Synod to vote on – hopefully in late January. Look out for the advertisement in the Church Times later this month!
