Here are some of the highlights, and some grateful thanks too. Annual Meeting: It's wonderful to begin this season of Advent with our Annual Meeting on the 1st of December. Often, the AGM is a time for thanks, and I wanted to take this moment to reiterate my thanks to you all – for all that you have contributed to the life of our church and communities, in the past year.
