

Celebrating the Resurrection: A Message of Hope and Renewal

Dear Church Family,

As we enter into this glorious season of Easter, we are reminded of the incredible hope we have in the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Easter is not only a time of celebration but also a time of reflection on the profound truth that through His death and resurrection, we have been given the gift of a new and eternal life.

In Matthew 28 we read: The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay.'

The empty tomb declares the victory of life over death, hope over despair, and light over darkness. Jesus has risen, and in His resurrection, we are invited to share in the eternal life He promises to all who believe. We invite you to join us for any of our services this Easter season, as we celebrate the resurrection together, and I pray that we would each know the deep inner joy and abundant life we have in Christ.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

EASTER RECIPE

Simnel Cake

Traditionally eaten at Easter, although it used to be specifically associated with Mothering Sunday; offering a respite from 40 days of religious austerity. The twelve balls on top of the cake represent the 11 disciples (excluding Judas of course).

RECIPE (Mary Berry)

Ingredients

175 g soft butter or margarine, plus extra for greasing
175 g light muscovado sugar
3 eggs
175 g self-raising flour
175 g sultanas
90 g currants
90 g glacé cherries, quartered, rinsed, and dried
30 g candied peel, roughly chopped
Grated zest of 1 large lemon
1 tsp. ground mixed spice

Decoration

500 g almond paste2 tbsp. apricot jam1 egg whiteDeep 18 cm (7 in) round loose-bottomed cake tin

Method

1. Roll out one-third of the almond paste and using the base of the cake tin as a guide, cut out an 18 centimetre circle.

2. Grease the cake tin and line the bottom and side with greaseproof paper.

3. Combine all the ingredients in a bowl. Beat well until thoroughly blended. Spoon half of the cake mixture into the prepared tin and smooth the surface. Top with the round of almond paste.

4. Spoon the remaining cake mixture on top and level the surface.

5. Bake in a preheated oven at 150°C/gas mark 2 for two and a quarter hours or until golden brown and firm to the touch.

6. Cover the top of the cake with greaseproof paper if it is browning too quickly. Leave to cool for 10 minutes, then remove from the tin, and leave to cool completely.

7. Warm the jam and use to brush the top of the cake.

8. To decorate, roll out half of the remaining almond paste and use the tin to cut out an 18 centimetre round. Put on top of the jam and crimp the edges. Roll the remaining almond paste into 11 even-sized balls. Place around the edge of the cake, attaching them with egg white.

9. Brush the tops of the balls and the almond paste with egg white. Place under a hot grill for one to two minutes, until the balls are golden.
