

JUNE MESSAGE

Dear Readers,

Welcome to June, the wonders of May's weather and the scent of the bluebells now behind us, although cold nights and the lack of rain have made life difficult for farmers and growers. In the Church's calendar, June brings the feasts, or red-letter days, of Pentecost (8th) and Trinity Sunday (15th) and the conclusion of the Easter season. Then comes another feast on the first Thursday after Trinity (June 19th) which might look like a repetition. This is Corpus Christi, or the Day of Thanksgiving for the Holy Eucharist. You might think, 'But that was Maundy Thursday'. Since the thirteenth century it has been recognized that a feast day for the Eucharist outside the Easter season, and separate from the sorrows of Holy Week, should have its own focus. Throughout the Church, East and West, and in all languages and traditions, the Eucharist gives us all a common language, a common way of expressing our purpose and self-understanding. Attending church in any foreign country, you might not understand the language, but you would very quickly pick up just where in the worship you were and be able to play your part in it.

At every celebration of the Eucharist, we rehearse the pattern of taking, breaking, blessing and giving of simple bread and wine; just as our Lord's own life was taken, blessed, broken and given. In our own celebration of the gift of our lives, we are called to follow the same pattern. We ourselves are taken and blessed through Baptism and shaped and nourished to give ourselves to our Lord and the world in which we serve each other. So it is that worldwide the Church speaks a very different language compared with the greed, envy, aggression and warmongering that we currently witness. And while we here have the freedom to articulate and practice our faith, many abroad do not. Nevertheless, works of mercy and kindness, forgiveness and reconciliation, are undertaken by brave people often at great risk. Not only by Christians, of course, but by humanitarians too, all knowing that only love works in the end and never power or force. We can remember that Jesus wept for the fate of Jerusalem, as we weep for Gaza, Ukraine, for the war bereaved, for those seeking refuge. The Feast of Corpus Christi holds out to the world a much better way. In cities all over

the world the festival will be observed with processions and feasting. It's how the world deserves to be.
