

OBITUARY

VENETIA FORBES

Venetia Forbes died very peacefully at home at Earlstoun, Dalry on 17th June, aged 91, with her family by her side.

Venetia's long involvement with St Margaret's began in 1995 following her marriage to Derick, after she had been widowed. She had previously lived in West Sussex where she was much involved in her local church at Elsted. She and Derick have been regular worshippers with us and loyal supporters of St. Margaret's, with many friends among the congregation. Venetia was a cheerful and conscientious President of the Ladies Guild for many years, turning her hand to whatever needed doing. Each year she would regularly help to run the Tombola Stall at the Alternative Games in New Galloway – whatever the weather - and delighted in using her flower arranging skills as often as she could. She took particular pleasure in helping decorate the Church at Christmas and Easter. She and Derick generously hosted social events for the Church at Earlstoun, including Games Nights, Lent Lunches and the annual Harvest Lunch. They were both gracious and welcoming hosts.

Venetia is already greatly missed. She was one of the kindest and gentlest of people. Whilst she was a much-loved member of the community, with a keen and playful sense of humour, her family meant everything to her.

Our sympathies go out to Derick and her children, grandchildren, great grandchildren and stepdaughters.

A Service of Thanksgiving in celebration of Venetia's life will be held on Friday, 18th July at St. Margaret's at 11.30 am.

A list poem on the Trinity

Here's a list of words you didn't know you needed, Important words, doctrinal terms, (And most of them are creeded!) One.

We say that God is Trinity Not solely in economy (That's a fancy word for history) But also in eternity.

God is not one with different forms, Instead, self-differentiation is the norm. Eternally, relationally and ontologically God is Three.

We come to the Father through the Son, We glorify God through the Son, It's not odd that it's through the Son Because, *monogenes*, there's only one, And the Father and the Son are one.

There's that word again.

All three persons are uncreated
But the Son is eternally generated.
So the Father, uniquely, is of none.
Of the Father, is his begotten Son.
Of the Father and Son,
Is the Spirit who proceeds—
And I'll spare you a lecture on the history of the creeds.

This order doesn't mean there's a hierarchy (Remember, we see through a mirror darkly!) All three are co-equal In authority and power, It's just there's a sequel Where for us and for our Salvation the Son came in subordination—Taking the form of a servant.

Yes, the Son, the eternal Word
Was born in flesh, grew, bled and died,
Unjustly tried and crucified,
But the Father raised him up to life.
And now having defeated death
He will never die.
And there are many more words
I could give along these lines.

But as for the doctrine of the Trinity, It's a contemplated product of church history. There is no ending of its brain-bending twists, But this is the end of my didn't-need-to-know list.
