PRIEST IN CHARGE

A Time of Rest and Renewal

Dear Church Family,

As we move through the height of summer, we are reminded of the importance of rest, renewal, and the quiet moments of peace that allow us to reconnect with God and each other. This month, we might find ourselves reflecting on the blessings of Sabbath and the importance of taking time to rest, just as God did after the creation of the world. The summer season provides a perfect opportunity to embrace this idea of rest, and what better place to do so than the serene and tranquil setting of Loch Ken in the heart of Galloway!

Since I moved here, I've spent many an hour walking along the banks of, and swimming in Loch Ken, and have found it to be a beautiful and peaceful place to go, especially when I've been in need of rest and reflection.
