In the hustle and bustle of this season, it's important to remember why we celebrate Christmas - the gift of Jesus Christ. This season reminds us of God's love and the hope we have through Him. As a church family and community, may we celebrate together and show God's love to those around us.

As ever, we have lots of different opportunities for everyone to be welcomed in this Christmas time. We hope that you will find the services and events that are right for you. Our Christmas season begins with the New Galloway Lights Walk Down on Sunday 7th December. St Margaret's hosted this for the first time last year, and we are thrilled to repeat the experience. It's a real collaboration of time and resources from across our community, and we look forward to working with LING, the Golf Club and the Catstrand to bring this Christmas gathering to life. Details are in the Christmas brochure and our Christmas flyers.

For the first time, this year we will be holding a Blue Christmas Service on Friday 19th December at 4.00pm. If you've not encountered this service before, let me tell you more. Sometimes we don't 'feel' Christmassy – we might have lost a loved one, or be feeling sad, lonely, or overwhelmed. This gentle service offers a moment of quiet reflection in the midst of the busyness of the season. There will be an opportunity to light a candle in memory, or choose a blue bauble and place it on the Christmas tree.

These services go alongside our Carol Service for the community, our Christmas Eve Interactive Family Nativity (come dressed as a character from the nativity, or borrow one of our costumes) and of course, our Christmas Day Communion, as we celebrate the joy of Christ's birth.

This is a little bit in advance, but I wanted to take a moment to thank everyone who is making our Christmas services possible by supporting them in prayer and with practical help – we couldn't manage Christmas without you all! If anyone would like to volunteer over Christmas, or indeed in the New Year, please do get in touch – whether that's welcoming, the flowers, prayers or coffee, it all helps!

I will be taking some time off post-Christmas to rest and recharge, but for now, may I wish you all a blessed, joyful and peaceful Christmas! Merry Christmas to all, and to all, a good night.
