NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE

The Rt Rev Dr Gregor Duncan 11 October 1950 - 21 November 2025

A Requiem Mass was held for Bishop Gregor, former Bishop of Glasgow and Galloway, on 11th December at St Ninian's Pollokshields. The service was led by Bishop Nick, the current Bishop of Glasgow and Galloway, with Verity Brown, the Rector of St Ninian's, assisting. The preacher was the Rt Rev Dr Michael Ipgrave, 99th Bishop of the Diocese of Lichfield, a lifelong friend of Bishop Gregor's ever since they started as ordinands together over 40 years ago.

Over 200 people attended the funeral - family and friends as well as people from all across the Diocese who had worked and worshipped with Bishop Gregor over many years. And of course lots of clergy and I counted at least seven Bishops. It was a very moving service with wonderful music and readings (and lots of incense), all of which had been chosen by Bishop Gregor himself. The only change made to his stipulations was the sermon - apparently he had told his old friend, Bishop Michael, only to preach on the Gospel (Matthew 11: 25-30) and not to turn it into a eulogy. However, Bishop Michael chose to disregard this and gave an excellent tribute, as well as preaching on the Gospel! It was all a most fitting 'goodbye' for a kind, intelligent and deeply spiritual man.
