A LETTER FROM THE VESTRY

Dear All

As you know, Revd. Dawn will be starting her new job as Canon Missioner for the Diocese on 15th February, so the Vestry would like to update you on what will happen here going forward. But firstly, we must express our immense gratitude for all that Dawn has done for St. Margaret's since moving here from Leicestershire three years ago.

'The Church is Open' sign fronting the road, which Dawn instigated, best encapsulates the positive impact she has made. From the very beginning, she has poured her energy and enthusiasm into every aspect of church and community life. As well as ensuring the Eucharist was celebrated every Sunday, with thoughtful preaching and sensitive prayers, she has tried various other offerings such as a monthly 'Sundays @ 4' slot, including Forest Church and a pet blessing service to coincide with the feast day of St Francis of Assissi. Additional services at Christmas included an Interactive Family Nativity on Christmas Eve and a Blue Christmas service – a gentle and quiet reflection amid the frantic activity of the season.

Within the church itself, installing Wi-Fi enabled us to become one of the first churches in Galloway to have a card payment machine – useful not just for Sunday donations but for all events such as the annual Plant and Bake Sale. Commissioning a logo has pulled together our identity as a church and given us cohesion across notices, service booklets, pew sheets, posters etc. More recently our new noticeboard outside the lychgate gives easy to read information on forthcoming services and events.

Dawn quickly became a 'well-kent' face in New Galloway, becoming involved with LING, the CatStrand, local singing groups and the school, and has been determined that St Margaret's should be for everyone, not just churchgoers. For instance, for the last two years St Margaret's was the destination point for the 'Christmas Lights Switch On' in New Galloway

with over 80 folk enjoying entertainment from the Glenkens Singers along with mulled wine and shortbread.

Dawn's kindness and sensitivity towards the bereaved, anyone unwell or struggling has been everything you could wish for in a priest, and this despite a major health challenge of her own in her first year here. You will be much missed Dawn, and we wish you and your family all the best as you embark on your next chapter!

Our own next chapter: we are now officially in vacancy and Bishop Nick and our Rural Dean Elizabeth Breakey are being very supportive. They are working closely with the Vestry to ensure that 'normal service' will continue as much as possible. We are most fortunate to have the help and support of Canons Barry Gilbert and Stuart Bain who between them will be taking more services for us over the next few months, *deo gratias*.

We, and our friends at Challoch, have sadly realised that sharing a Priest-in-Charge is not sustainable due to the distances involved but we are grateful for the close ties we have made with everyone at All Saints'. With regard to the new vacancy, and following discussion with Bishop Nick, we are planning to advertise for a Priest on a half-stipend plus a house basis. Financially, the costs will be similar to those of the last three years, subject to the continuation of a Diocesan grant. Over the next few weeks, there will be a lot of 'vacancy procedure' to work through, before we get to advertising the position, including updating our Church Profile which will be circulated to everyone for their comments. Further updates next month.
